## **Kingdom Of The Blue Whale**

Just imagine you are looking through the eye of the Blue Whale itself – this is what you will see – her newborn calf, her pod, her habitat and her environment. From the perspective of the whale, National Geographic Crittercam Kingdom Of The Blue Whale will immerse you in their world.

This programme captures the first ever underwater footage of a baby blue whale - perhaps one only month old. In one scene, the mother whale swims directly below the baby blue calf, helping the baby stay close to the surface.

National Geographic Crittercam technology also captures unique footage of blue whale eating krill (tiny shrimp-like organisms), from the blue whale's perspective. You will also see extremely rare images of a baby whale shark and juvenile loggerhead turtle.

In this special programme Marine Biologists confirm three new findings in Blue whale behaviour never witnessed before – courtship, calving and winter feeding.

The special also takes you to a Japanese fish market where whale meat is sold for human consumption- and lets you decide what you think about this important issue for our planet.

Watching this programme will help you understand the magnificent blue whale species –the largest creature on earth – and will give you great insight into the wonders of its life, how it communicates, how it feeds, where it lives and how it gives birth and raises its young.
